News from 2023

- In May, Myddelton Square celebrated the King's coronation with a picnic, games and decoration in Myddelton Square Gardens. Our neighbour Amy applied for a council grant and organised the event, which was co-funded and supported by MSA.
- The New River Head platform (accessible via the right hand gate on Myddelton Passage) was re-opened with a new bench, donated by MSA, and some new information panels. The area will eventually be incorporated into the new gardens in the Quentin Blake Centre for Illustration.

- In August the MSA hosted its annual Summer Garden Party. We were lucky with the weather again with excellent food and company provided by our members.
- Some significant tree damage occurred in late summer. Three large branches fell, damaging a van and the railings. The affected trees have been felled/trimmed.



• Sadly burglaries occurred in Myddelton Square in late August. An intruder gained access to several properties via their first floor balconies. The suspect has since been arrested and taken to court. We remind neighbours to be mindful of home security and be careful letting unexpected callers in.

MSA is represented on the Clerkenwell Safer Neighbourhood panel – a liaison between the community and local police team; if you wish us to raise issues about crime or anti-social behaviour in the area then email <u>hello@myddeltonsquare.co.uk</u>.

 No filming occurred on the square in 2023, but a film crew is expected on Monday 29th January 2024. Parking suspensions will be minimal, but there will be road closures on Myddelton Square and Chadwell Street which may cause disruption. The film crew is contacting residents by post in the coming weeks with more info and to address any concerns.

200 years of Myddelton Square

During the year, we have received several enquiries from people, as far afield as Australia, researching their family history. We are fortunate to live in a historical area that is well documented, with much information accessible on-line and the London Metropolitan Archives close by for a deeper delve. Two hundred years ago, the plans for Myddelton Square were underway with the building of the houses, as well as the church and ornamental gardens, completed between 1824-1836. During this significant anniversary period, we would like to hear any stories you may have to share about the Square, perhaps through research of your house history or memories of the Square in earlier years. Myddelton Square Gardening Group (MSGG)

We're pleased to report that 2023 has been a very rewarding year.

The RHS offered us 50 free plants at the end of the Hampton Court Flower Show. All have been planted throughout the Gardens, including the North Border.


This border has also been planted with numerous bulbs including narcissi, tulips, and alliums, which will provide a colourful display in spring 2024. Planting here is challenging – the bed is dry and mostly in deep shade. We are trialling various plants to see which cope best with these conditions.

This year, the South Border was colourful from early spring to December. The large bed at the back of the church was a mass of colour. Both beds have benefitted from donated plants.

Unwelcome events have been turned to our advantage! Wood from the fallen tree was recycled and the mulch spread onto the beds.

We have started creating sensory beds in the garden near benches, including lavender and scented herbs. Amanda Gray, a resident in the Square, donated a bed of scented bushes including evergreen Sarcococca as edging with small sweet-scented flowers in winter. This is to the left of the main gates.

Thank you to all who have given



donations for plants, and the volunteers who've given so much of their time working in the gardens.

Quentin Blake Centre for Illustration

This has been a busy year for Quentin Blake Centre for Illustration who are working to restore the historic New River Head waterworks, behind Myddelton Square and Amwell Street, and open it up into the public as galleries, learning spaces, publicly accessible gardens, a shop and café. Following the granting of planning permission last year, the plans have been further developed with extensive input from local residents and community groups. With significant progress made towards achieving the funding goal, work is due to begin in early summer, with the aim of opening towards the end of 2025.

In the meantime you can learn about New River Head's fascinating history at the Viewing Platform, off Myddelton Passage. The Platform is usually open Thursday to Sunday, with a bench funded by MSA and new information panels illustrated by Nina Chakrabarti. Illustration projects are underway with local schools and community groups, a further open day was held in September and the Centre recently hosted a pop-up studio at the Angel Central shopping centre.
