St Mark's Church News

The recent coffee morning, organised by Jill Courtnell, successfully raised £270 for the MacMillan Cancer Charity.

The <u>Harvest Festival</u>, 13th October, led by the children of the Sunday School and 4th Clerkenwell Guide Group, the Church was decorated for the occasion.



Lighting upgrade: work is underway in the Church from 21 October to 13 December to improve the lighting. During this time, the worship space will be closed Monday - Friday and there will be normal access for the "New to You" shop on Saturdays and for services on Sunday. She was an indomitable lady with a talent for both art and friendship. Her 100th birthday would have been in February 2019.

Sheila Gaeton 21st December 2018. Sheila and Michael came to the Square as newly weds in 1962. She was 86 when she died and her funeral took place in Covent Garden where the family attended church. A friend to many residents, Sheila was always pleased to come to our annual summer lunch in the Gardens.

Harry Potts 27th August 2019. Harry was 89 when he died. He and Monica came to the Square in 1984. His career was in Education and in retirement he used his skills in woodworking to make many beautiful musical instruments. He was active in the fight to preserve the Gardens from unwelcome developments by the freeholder. Harry edited the MSQGG Bulletins and Square Roots and will be remembered by some as an enthusiastic BBQ chef at our lunches.

Myddelton Square Gardening Group News from Elaine Smith

Over 600 bulbs were planted by MSGG during Open Gardening Days last Autumn resulting in a spectacular display of bulbs followed by alliums this spring. Continuing the project to restore the Gardens, the overgrown and neglected bed on the south side was dug over and planted last October and November. From January onwards and throughout the spring, summer and autumn the bed has provided continuous colour and a magnet for bees and butterflies.



The type of fencing used in the Royal Parks is considered to be the most attractive to protect the two beds and has been suggested to the Council. There are still some points to be discussed but hopefully the fencing can be fitted this year.

Thanks to the MSGG for all the hard work that is transforming the Gardens. Through Open Gardening Days, and frequent watering throughout the summer, plants, particularly in the centre bed under the oak, have been saved. Digging out thistles and working in mud and rain are all part of the job! Thanks also to all the new people who have joined and to Annette Pollock, the Landscape Architect who kindly provides her professional plans and advice.



There are 3 Open Gardening Days coming up on Sunday 20 and 27 October (1-4pm) and Sunday 10 November (from 12.30pm). Everyone is welcome to come and join us. We always have an enjoyable time regardless of the weather.









Trees: Islington Council, at our request, has pruned back some of the trees within the Square, although we continue to be in discussions with the Council to carry out further work. We have been informed that in future the Council's policy will be to carry out

work on trees in their parks and gardens on a three year cycle. This will replace the pruning and maintenance on an ad hoc basis and will ensure each garden or park is surveyed and necessary work carried out every three years. This will fit better with the Council's budgeting constraints.
